Jeffrey Dorfman is a professor of applied economics at The University of Georgia. He earned a Ph.D. in agricultural economics from the University of California, Davis in 1989 and has been at UGA since. He is the co-director of UGA's Land Use Studies Initiative and was the founding director of the Center for Agribusiness and Economic Development. He has written one book, over 60 journal articles, and numerous book chapters, reports, and op-ed pieces on a wide variety of economic and statistical topics. His current research program focuses on the economics of growth, economic development and farmland preservation; the measurement of productivity and efficiency; and the application of statistical methods to economic data. He has testified to committees of the U.S. Senate, the Georgia State House, and the U.S.D.A. His list of consulting clients includes numerous counties, cities, and towns throughout the Southeast, nonprofits such as the American Farmland Trust and The Georgia Conservancy, and corporations including Sprint. He makes frequent presentations about the economics of growth and development to citizen groups, elected officials, government agencies, planning professionals, economic developers, home builders, and other real estate professionals.
